I. Hegemonic Threat, Hegemonic War, And Objective Threat

A Hegemon - Potentially Hegemonic Within An Anarchic System

1. Hegemon - Predominant Power

2. Objective Threat - Threatens Sovereignty of All Other Powers In System

a. Hegemon Can Dictate Policies Counter To The Interests of Other States

3. Hegemons Cannot Be Defeated /
Any Other Power In System Can Be Defeated By COALITIONS

1. Balance To Block
