

MOVIE ASSIGNMENT

Following are a list of movies with suggested topics. The topics listed and chapters referred to are not the only ones that apply. If you feel that there other concepts which would work feel free to use them.

Please be sure to follow all the parts of the questions on the assigned sheet.

Movie/Video Review

To encourage you to become critical observers of interpersonal communication skills (and, therefore, lifelong learners of communication), choose a book or movie/video to review in light of the concepts learned and practiced in this course. Write a 4-5 page paper (typed double-spaced) in which you develop *one* of the two prompts below:

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. In an introductory paragraph, <i>briefly</i> summarize the movie/video so your reader has a general idea of the overall story. End with a thesis statement about three interpersonal communication concepts you will develop in the body of your essay. 2. For each of the interpersonal communication concepts you have chosen, consider how it figures into the plot and/or development of characters: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Describe how the concept is applied in the story; be specific as you describe the character(s) and/or event(s) where this concept is demonstrated. Use appropriate terms from the text. b. Evaluate whether the concept is applied effectively or ineffectively (good example or bad example). Take a position and explain <i>why</i> you believe as you do. c. Analyze the consequences of the concept's effective or ineffective application. Consider short-term and long-term consequences to the character(s) and/or plot. (Project beyond the actual book or movie/video.) 3. In a concluding paragraph, summarize your insights regarding interpersonal communication as demonstrated in this book or movie/video. What are the major lessons to be learned? 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. In an introductory paragraph, <i>briefly</i> summarize the movie/video so your reader has a general idea of the overall story. Identify <i>one character</i> who, if this person were real, would benefit from taking this course. End with a thesis statement about three interpersonal communication skills you believe this person should develop; you will develop each of these recommendations in the body of your essay. 2. For each of the interpersonal communication skills your believe this one character should develop: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Describe specific examples from the book or movie/video which demonstrate weakness in the identified skill area. Your reader should be able to picture the weakness from your description. b. Explain <i>what</i> you would teach this person and <i>why</i>. Use appropriate terms from the text, and support your recommendations with clear and logical reasoning. c. Analyze how the skill, if applied, would change the person's character and/or affect the plot of the story. Consider short-term and long-term outcomes. (Project beyond the actual book or movie/video.) 3. In a concluding paragraph, summarize your insights regarding interpersonal communication as demonstrated in this book or movie/video. What are the major lessons to be learned?

A list of possible resources is attached. All resources on this list are considered "pre-approved." If you choose a resource that is *not* listed, you *must* have it approved by your instructor before your paper is due. *Do not write a paper about a book or movie/video that is NOT on this list UNLESS you have had it approved by your instructor.*
