

- **Part one** of your assignment is to **research the topic**:

What is **Public Domain**? Does it include YOUTUBE? Research a Public Domain **court case** example involving YouTube.

- **Part two -- Page one:** Type a **half-page**, double-spaced, Arial font/size 12, Microsoft Word **summary of your topic** ....and then **half-page response** to your topic. On page two, discuss a court case which involves your topic. Also include on page two of your report a list of your references—entitled "**References**". You must have at least **two references!** (*No particular style (ie: MLA) of reference. Your reference can be from the web or other types of reference material*) *When you finish Part Two you should have two pages of information!*
- **Part three – Report a brief summary** (1-2 minutes) of your findings via Powerpoint to the class at your topic/lecture date listed above. Slide one – Partner's names, topic, comic strip; Slide two –(brief!) presentation bullet points covering your topic and court case.
- **Part four** -- Create a **comic strip!** Using one of these web sites to assist you -- you will create a comic strip to explain your topic!

    - Select "Comic Strip"
    - When you have finished, click the "Download" button
    - Save your comic as a PDF
    - Open your PDF file and highlight the cartoon
    - Right-click and choose "Copy Image"
  - Open Microsoft Word document you created in a **Part Two**.
    - Paste your cartoon on Page Three of the Word Document.
    - Include a **header on the Word Document** with **your section number** and **group names**

*OR* – Do a screen shot of your comic ... Paste onto page three of the Word Document. **Crop the comic** so only the comic strip is visible.
