Question

Answer the following question on Horace Walpole's *The Castle of Otranto* OR Ann Radcliffe's *A Sicilian Romance*. Your response should be presented as an essay.

In Gothic literature, the castle is commonly understood as a contested space. Consider how the castle in *The Castle of Otranto* OR *A Sicilian Romance* is a contested space with respect to one of the following pairings:

- rational and supernatural
- father and child
- past and present
- male and female

Guidelines

- Your response should demonstrate your understanding of the text and the themes of the unit.
 Direct engagement with the text is an expectation of this task. Your independent knowledge of the whole text should be apparent in your response.
- A high-quality response will be persuasive, critical—analytical, knowledgeable about the overall
 themes and ideas of the texts, and be able to demonstrate a good understanding of the text's
 details.
- No secondary source research is required for this task, but may benefit your argument. Websites are banned for this assignment and should not be used as reference material.
- Work needs to be correctly and appropriately referenced, using the Chicago (footnotes) or MLA style. No other referencing styles are permissible in this unit, and marks will be deducted for use of other referencing styles.
- Your work must meet the Literacy Minimum Standard Level 2/3 in order to qualify for a passing grade.
