Assignment 3: Perception and the Photographer (Introduction)

This assignment is designed for you to write an article about images in the context of how the experiences, background, personality and development of a photographer influence the ways in which they perceive, interpret and shoot images. In essence, it is an examination of the extent to which photographic images come from the photographer more than from the subject.

THE STATEMENT

A photograph is shaped more by the person behind the camera than by what is in front of them.

Assignment 3: Written article (20 marks)

- 1. Select a photographer from any *named* genre who has, or has had, public recognition for their photographic work and write an article of *no more than 1500 words* about their life and work.
- 2. Create an imaginative title; include your name, photos (with captions, copyright information and/or references) and references to the literature consulted (2 marks)
- 3. State, describe and examine the **genre and subject matter** of these images (consider, for example type of subject(s), location or setting, artistic values, political, social or other significance) (4 marks)
- 4. Research and describe those aspects of the **photographer's life** (e.g. background, experiences, personality) that you believe have been influential in their style of photography (4 marks)
- 5. Research, select and include a range of photographs (3-6) that represent the photographer's most important subjects (body of work). Clearly explain why you chose these images and incorporate the opinions of others (4 marks)
- 6. Explain, within the context of this photographer's work and images selected, whether you support, refute or "sit on the fence" with respect to the "**Statement**". Illustrate your answer by specific reference to life events, character traits and photographic products that you have introduced in your answer to Parts 3,4,5 (6 marks)

Assignment 3: Presentation (10 marks)

- 1. Prepare a 6-10 min presentation based on your article to give in class on (dates to confirm) (10 marks)
 - State your chosen topic and give its creative title in your opening slide
 - Provide highlights of the life and work of the photographer
 - Comment on your chosen images: why you selected them; and why/how their inclusion supports your argument either in support, or otherwise, for the "The Statement"
 - Create two questions and pose these to your audience in a way that generates further interest and understanding around your presentation
